LOC – LOSS OF CONTROL

The Number 1 Cause of FATAL Aircraft Accidents

Loss of Control is Consistently the LEADING Cause of Aircraft Accidents.

Why do pilots, Which is US, Lose Control of our Aircraft Inflight.

Lack of Training, Lack of Currency, Instrument Failure, Weather (VFR into IMC)

Stall / Spin on Base to Final Turn, Runway Excursion, “Moose Stall”.

All are possibilities. However, there are many other causes. During this Seminar, we will review some LOC accidents, and discuss the Causes and How They May have Been Prevented. We will also discuss What we, Individually and as a member of the Flying Community, can do to lessen the probability of LOC.

All pilots, regardless of rating or experience, including CFIs, aircraft owners and partners and Flying Club members are encouraged to attend this informative seminar.
