Meteorology is an imperfect science. Ballooning is a form of aviation that is very vulnerable to changes in weather. Having a solid understanding of the expected conditions is vital to the safety interests of the pilot, passengers and crew. Mr. Temeyer will discuss where forecasts can stray from expected conditions and the things that the pilot can do to make safety conscious decisions.
