IA Seminar - Safety Starts in the Hangar

The safety of any flight begins with a properly maintained aircraft. Many factors figure into providing a properly maintained aircraft. During this seminar we will present some subtle and some not so subtle, but equally important factors and solicit your inputs to create dialog on the issues that you face every day. We will cover subjects including; Compliance Philosophy, Avionics Installs and Interfaces, Pressure, Stress and Fatigue, Accident Investigation, ADSB Interfaces, Compliance and failure to follow procedures, Magneto Operation, Inspection and Maintenance, and [FAA Safety.gov](http://FAASafety.gov)/FAASTeam functions. The seminar runs from 0800 to 1700.
