TFRs and Intercept Procedures

Temporary Flight Restrictions (TFRs) and knowing how to avoid them are an important part of aviation, especially in a large metropolitan area. TFRs specific to Houston will be discussed (stadium, etc), as well as the regulations regarding the different types of TFRs that pilots can be expected to see around the country. Intercept procedures will also be discussed in the event that a TFR violation leads to an airborne intercept.

Directions: American Flyers is located next to Gill Aviation (main terminal) at Hooks Airport. The seminar will be held in the American Flyers classroom. FLYING IN: Park your airplane on the Gill Aviation Ramp, and the American Flyers office is right next to Gill Aviation. DRIVING: From I-45: Exit FM2920 west until you get to Stuebner-Airline Rd. Take a left on Stuebner-Airline rd and the main terminal is the first right after the gas station. Park in the parking lot in front of Gill Aviation. The American Flyers office is right next to Gill on the left hand side from the parking lot. From 249: Exit Spring-Cyrpess and head east. Follow Spring-Cyrpess until you see Stuebner-Airline Rd and take a left. Gill Aviation is all the way at the end of the road right before 2920. Take a left into the Gill Aviation (Main Terminal) parking lot.
