Directions: Please see attached document outlining how to access Texas Flight. If you have any questions or get confused on where to go, please call Texas Flight at 832-717-0766. Enter through the airport gate that is about halfway between 2920 and Spring Cypress. You should see signs for Texas Flight pointing to this gate. At the gate, press 001# to call the front office. Tell them you are attending the safety seminar and they will let you in. After entering the gate, you should see a road to the left with a Texas Flight sign pointing in that direction. After that road ends, you should take a right and see Texas Flight on the left.
