back home in Syracuse, NY now requires that return as soon as possible.

Fortunately, the weather at your destination KSYR is completely clear and the last half of your flight will be VMC. So, you decide to make an IFR departure from KBML with a final cruise altitude of 6000 MSL.

All navigational aids and equipment are functioning properly and there are no GPS outages are expected.

METAR: KBML 061600Z AUTO 11006KT
1SM OVC009 10/8 A2992 RMK AO2

You pick up your clearance on the ground from Boston Center over the phone. What should you include in your flight planning? The scenario ends when you reach your cruising altitude.

This is not a competition! It is an exercise to provide common ground for discussion with other pilots.

In the time remaining, we will review the Wings Program and discuss how to make it work for you. Until then, stay safe and we hope to see you at the meeting.

Directions: Travel West on US 84 E from Waco towards McGregor, turn right into airport entrance just past the Exxon station and then first right past fuel tanks, direct to EAA hanger facility.
