

## CO -- It's a Gas!!!

Is carbon monoxide a threat to you when flying? Are you sure? When was the last time you thoroughly (and properly) checked? The combustion engine in the airplane you fly creates colorless and odorless carbon monoxide (CO). This CO can inadvertently enter the cabin area and pose a serious threat while flying. Learn more about this potentially deadly and silent killer and how you can improve your chances of not having carbon monoxide poisoning happen to you.
