

Driving Directions to Shortstop Airfield

Traveling east on Highway 380 from McKinney, it's approximately 18 miles to Farmersville. If you are traveling north on highway 78 out of Garland to Highway 380 turn right (east) onto 380.

After you pass the Dairy Queen on highway 380, it is approximately 1.8 miles to County Road 653, where you'll turn left. This road will "T" into County Road 655. Turn right. The house is .4 miles on the right. Address is 2464 CR 655. Phone (972) 784-7544.

PLEASE do not park off the side of the driveway, but go all the way to the hanger, and you'll be directed parking there.

Airfield Information for Shortstop

If you plan to fly in, please be up on your short field techniques. Unicom is 122.725; runway is 17/35 with left hand patterns. The field is only 1500 feet. The approaches are clear, no powerlines or trees with a railroad on the south end. Observe the railroad east and west to see if a train is approaching. Do not land until the train has passed the runway. If landing runway 17, watch for cars on the road.

If you plan on flying, give Mel a call (972) 784-7544, and get the airfield condition report. Rain has an effect on parking. It is also helpful if you have any special requirements. Plus, we will know how many to expect.

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Sun-N-Fun Continued

The fact that Sun n Fun began as a fly-in for homebuilders and general aviation has not been lost. This year the majority exhibitors were displaying aviation related items. There appeared to be much less of jewelry and trinket sellers. Exhibitors like Dynon had plenty of equipment to demonstrate and staff to answer questions. Most of the usual major exhibitors were present. There several exhibitors specifically geared for the homebuilder selling neatly packaged aircraft hardware and parts. Many vendors had show specials running.

There were many new products introduced at the show. Two especially interesting product are the BOM and Beacon from Levil Aviation. The BOM is a completely self contained AHRS/AOA powered by it own small propeller that Wi-Fi links to your iPad or whatever. It mounts to an inspection cover. The Beacon is 2020 compliant ADS-B out device that is completely contained in the antenna. The only external connections are the GPS antenna/ power and RS-232 to your display. Very interesting! Garmin had a slew of releases, too numerous to review here.

Also for the pilots and homebuilders were the forums and workshops. These ran all week and covered everything from ADS-B to vacuum bagging.

My only regret at Sun n Fun is that because I was working most of the day as a volunteer I did not get to see more of the event, especially the forums and workshops. As we do not work during the airshow I was able to get some photos of that and a few other sights. This is only small part of the entire event.

Patrouille de France is the precision aerobatic demonstration team of the French Air Force. Originating in 1931, it is the world's oldest precision flight demonstration teams. Pilots currently fly the Dassault/Dornier Alpha Jet.

Patrouille de France performed just one day on opening day. They are making a tour through the US to commemorate the 100th anniversary of America's entry into World war I and the accompanying advent of US air combat.

With the French team being here it gave the opportunity to see another unique aircraft. That would be the Airbus A400M which serves as the support aircraft for the Patrouille de France. Everyone that saw it said it looked like a C-17 with turboprops.

Stallion 51 pilot Lee Lauderback flew the "Crazy Horse" two place trainer Mustang in a solo performance, a heritage flight and in other formations.

Always impressive for sight and sound, six P-51s and their Merlin V12 engines in formation.



There were a few takers and no ground loops etc. Safety is always first at the event.

Other Sun-n-Fun announcements

Major fly-ins produce new product announcements. THis year most of the buzz was new ADS-B solutions, as that 2020 mandate gets nearer.

I see most solutions to move toward drop in transponder replacements, where all the components will fit into your transponder.

Garmin has done this with the GTX-335. IT is a ADS-B "out" only solution for those who get the "in" from another source. The GTX 335 is a Mode S Extended Squitter transponder with 1090 MHz output. Now through December 29, 2017, the GTX 335 ADS-B "Out" transponder with built-in WAAS GPS is for sale for the promotional price of \$2,995.



If you want the "IN" and the "OUT" in the same box, the Garmin GTX 345 will do that with the "out being linked to a tablet via Bluetooth interface for \$4,995.

Levil Aviation, being know for affordable outside the box solutions, announced two new products that are quite interesting.

The first is a self-powering, all-inone panel solution called the BOM. It's name coming from it obvious shape and the fact that it mounts under a wing.

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The BOM is battery powered and recharged by the wind turbine. It powers on by sensing engine vibration. Aimed at being a back up systemm, looks cool on your wing at the same time.

The second product from Levil is the simplest ADS-B

solution I have seen. Called "The Beacon" this device looks like a transponder blade antenna except there is electronics built into the base.

IT "sniffs" your transponder squawk code from your transponder antenna or you can directly connect it via RS-232 connection to your transponder.

The Beacon

On the integrated circuit board, there is a WAAS compliant GPS, and

an Altimeter encoder with a sensor that measures your static pressure. It also includes a small LCD interface to displays your squawk

code and reporting altitude. It does require running a GPS antenna to it, since you don't get a GPS signal on

the bottom of the aircraft.

The ultimate in plug and play solution.

Both products are not available yet, but should be in the near future.

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BasicMed Begins

From FAA.gov

General aviation pilots may take advantage of the regulatory relief in the BasicMed rule or opt to continue to use their FAA medical certificate. Under BasicMed, a pilot will be required to complete a medical education course every two years, undergo a medical examination every four years, and comply with aircraft and operating restrictions. For example, pilots using BasicMed cannot operate an aircraft with more than six people onboard and the aircraft must not weigh more than 6,000 pounds.

A pilot flying under the BasicMed rule must:

- possess a valid driver's license;
- consent to a National Driver Register check;
- have held a medical certificate that was valid at any time after July 15, 2006;
- have not had the most recently held medical certificate revoked, suspended, or withdrawn;
- have not had the most recent application for airman medical certification completed and denied;
- have taken a BasicMed online medical education course within the past 24 calendar months;
- have completed a comprehensive medical examination with any state-licensed physician within the past 48 months;
- have been found eligible for special issuance of a medical certificate for certain specified mental health, neurological, or cardiovascular conditions, when applicable; and
- not fly for compensation or hire.

Pilots can read and print the Comprehensive Medical Examination Checklist and learn about online BasicMed online medical courses at www.faa.gov/go/BasicMed

The is also published a link to the free online AOPA Self-Assessment Course that satisfies the requirement for pilots to complete a medical education course before operating under BasicMed.

Pilots must retain the completed exam checklist with their logbook, along with the certificate of completion from the online medical course.
