Teaching Loss of Control in GA Aircraft - CFI Open Forum - All Pilots are Welcome

This event is presented by Judy Phelps, who is one of the most knowledgeable and skilled Flight Instructors in the area of Loss of Control (LOC) because of her focus on Emergency Maneuvers Training.

Making ALL pilots aware of potential Loss of Control (LOC) scenarios that commonly and sadly result in fatal accidents is a fundamental responsibility of every professional CFI. Too often the vital importance of this awareness training is bypassed because it is not emphasized enough in training curriculums. Yet it remains a number one fatal causal factor in NTSB reports. This forum will review valuable instructional strategies CFIs can employ to enlighten ALL airmen at ALL levels of training on potential situations that can result in Loss of Control.

Directions: Arriving by car from the east, exit the Santa Paula Freeway (SR 126) at 10th street, turn right off the ramp, and then a quick left onto Harvard Boulevard. Turn left at the next signal at Eighth Street, under the freeway, left onto Santa Maria Street and park in the lot. Arriving from the west, exit the freeway at Palm Avenue, turn right and then a quick left onto Santa Maria Street, about a half mile to the end at the parking lot.
