Everyone is welcome to learn that Aeronautical Decision Making is a systematic approach to the mental process used by pilots to consistently determine the best course of action in response to a given set of circumstances. In other words, it is a systematic approach to risk assessment and stress management. Sounds easy, right? At this FAASafety Team Flight Instructor Open Forum we will explore ADM and how you can learn it for yourself and teach it to your students to assess risk and manage stress. Everyone is welcome especially Flight Instructors, Ground Instructors, Designated Pilot Examiners, and Instructors in training are welcome and encouraged to attend. Join your flight instructor colleagues and take an active role in improving safety in flight training!

Directions: Drive In: Exit Las Posas Road off 101 freeway, go south. At Pleasant Valley Road, turn right. At Airport Way, turn right. The Ventura County Department of Airports is the last building on the left.

Fly-In: Park in transient parking by Channel Islands Aviation, (CIA) walk out door, turn left out to street. At the T in the street look to right to Dept. of Airports sign.

NOTE: Remember to get Gate Code for RE-Entry onto airport when CIA closes.
