

Hot Stuff - Lithium Battery Fires Prevent Recognize Respond Report

This is an in-person presentation on lithium battery fires in flight. Lithium batteries power nearly every device on today's aircraft, from passenger PEDs and crew EFBs to medical and emergency equipment. Their high energy density, however, creates a unique fire risk through thermal runaways. This course prepares aircrew to prevent, recognize, and respond to lithium battery incidents in flight.

Just east of San Fernando Road on Osborne St. Take the Whiteman airport entrance marked by the CAP sign. Follow the road to the parking lot opposite the CAP building. Plenty of Free Parking. Seminar length is 2 hours.
