

## Stall Spin Awareness / Recovery and the Possible Turn

This seminar focuses on enhancing pilot awareness and decision-making during critical phases of flight, specifically addressing stalls, spins, and engine failures occurring shortly after takeoff. Attendees will gain a deeper understanding of the aerodynamics behind stalls and spins, how to recognize early warning signs, and proper recovery techniques. The session also covers practical strategies for handling engine-out scenarios on departure, including the risks of attempting a turnback and best practices for forced landings. Through case studies and scenario-based discussions, pilots will leave better equipped to handle these emergencies with confidence and composure.
