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June's first scenario is a low oil pressure alert shortly after a departure into clouds. Is it real or a failing sensor? Our second scenario is a pilot looking for options when the weather at his planned destination deteriorates. This one is based in the DC area so after we review it, we'll customize it and apply it to SOCAL.

Driving: Take I-5 to Palomar Airport Road. Go East 3 miles to the airport entrance. Administration building is the first building on the left as you enter the airport. Parking lot is the first left at the stop sign after you pass the administration building.

Flying: Park at transient parking or Western Flight. The administration building is a short walk to the South.
