Hypoxic Simulator (PROTE) Portable Reduced Oxygen Training Enclosure Presented by CAMI - UPDATE

You will have the opportunity to experience your Hypoxia symptoms first hand in the Portable Oxygen Simulator during the 20 minute exposure that is totally safe. This will be available in Reno from Dec 14 thru 18th. 80 pilots per day can be scheduled. This announcement is for the fifth and final One Half day, Dec 18th. See additional announcements for the other days. You must be 18 years old and have at least a 3rd class medical to enter the enclosure. APPROX. 1 WEEK BEFORE YOUR SCHEDULED DAY YOU WILL BE SENT AN EMAIL WITH A SUGGESTED TIME TO ARRIVE. THIS IS TO HELP THE FLOW THOURHGOUT THE DAY. IF THIS DOES NOT WORK FOR YOU, COME WHEN YOU CAN. The PROTE "flight" will last all of 6-8 minutes with those experiencing hypoxia being in the enclosure, off oxygen, for up to 5 minutes. The remainder of the time allows for recovery before exiting the enclosure. The entire PROTE evolution pre-brief, hypoxia exercise and debrief will last 20-30 minutes. . Additional announcements will be sent for each day available.

Directions: The enclosure will be erected inside a hangar. Pilot Briefings will be done in the conference room.
