Part 134 1/2: How Not to Commit a Violation of Part 135 Air Taxi Regulations

As we all know, private pilots may not be compensated in any way for their role as a pilot. Even pilots with a commercial certificate are limited to accepting payment for only a very small number of operations. Every year, both private and commercial pilots run afoul of regulations by inadvertently doing something that can be interpreted as acting as an air carrier. Part 135 is the section of the code that oversees Air Carrier Operations, and you don't want to get anywhere near it unless you actually are working for a Part 135 air carrier operation.
