# CFI Open Forum: Teaching Stalls and Stall Avoidance Safely

Flight Instructors play a critical role in the development of safe pilot skills, a role that cannot be overrated. From the first flight, student pilots need to understand the importance of maintaining the aircraft in safe flight, and the dangers of failing to fly the aircraft. Stall practice forms a critical component in the development of safe pilot skills. We teach students 2 important things: 1) how to detect an impending stall before it happens, and 2) how to quickly recover from a stall should one occur.

How do you teach stalls? What techniques have you learned over the years? What advice do you have for newer CFIs? FAASTeam representative and CFI Dan Dyer of San Carlos Flight Center will discuss the state of stall accidents in the country every year, and ways that flight instructors can help pilots avoid them.

Runway Incursion Avoidance is still an emphasis area for the FAASTeam and we will begin the presentation with a brief reminder to CFIs to encourage safe taxi techniques with students to help reduce incidents of runway incursion.
