Right Seat Workshop: Charts and Airspace

Pilot: "Good news. I think I've located our position. We seem to be halfway between a golf flag and a pink squiggly line." Co-Pilot: "Bad news. I don't see any pink lines or golf flags out the window." Have you ever tried to make sense of an Aeronautical Chart? Those large folded maps covered with lines, symbols, splashes of colors, and text in about 17 different font sizes. It can be a challenge unless you have some insight into the coding system, and the information the FAA is trying to convey. The best time to learn about charts is on the ground, before you've ever started the engine. San Carlos Flight Center regularly holds Right Seat Workshops intended to demystify flight for people that fly often as passengers with other pilots. If you regularly find yourself seated in the right seat for flights with your husband, wife, coworker, friend, or even a stranger, these workshops are just for you. This month's workshop, the fourth in our series, covers how to read and understand the aeronautical charts used in flying. We'll introduce topics of airspace and navigation and show how the chart can be a valuable aid to a pilot, or even to a right seater trying to figure out how long it is to the next destination. The Right Seat Workshop is a fee training event and open to anyone, including very new beginner pilots, but special emphasis
