## **IFR Round-Table: Lost Comms**

This event is part of our IFR Roundtable series of discussion groups, where advanced and novice IFR pilots share knowledge about particular aspects of instrument flight. Held every 8-10 weeks, we focus on one small IFR procedure or topic area and spend some time talking through challenges, definitions, techniques, and safety issues in that topic area. This session topic: Lost communications. It's bumpy, you haven't seen out the window for an hour or so, and you're expecting your approach to be close to minimums. You realize you haven't heard another voice for a few minutes, test your radio and confirm your fears. Your radios have failed and you have lost communication with air traffic control. We train for this, but how long ago was that? Are you prepared? Can you continue on your course? When can you descend? How low? Join SCFC CFI Adam Kelly for a discussion of procedures for lost communications. He will go over the relevant FARs and discuss steps to take to get yourself safely on the ground. Adam Kelly has been in love with aviation since he was a child, and comes from a family of accomplished aviators. He earned his Private Pilot Certificate in 2009 and in 2012 started pursuing aviation full time. He received his Commercial Pilot Certificate in 2012 and Certified Flight Instructor Rating in
