Intro to G1000: Screens and Knobs

What does this knob do? Where did they hide the weather page? How do I get this fancy device to make me a safer pilot? For years, the Garmin G1000 cockpit display panel system has set the standard for glass cockpit aircraft. For newcomers, however, the computer displays, buttons, knobs, and joysticks can be overwhelming. In this seminar we will start at the beginning and introduce pilots to the basic G1000 display screens and controls and explains what each is for. You'll find out what softkeys are and learn about the basics of the G1000 user interface paradigm. The intended audience level is beginner, so advanced functionality and system integration will not be discussed in this session. The Intro to G1000 seminars are an introductory series intended for pilots who are first learning about the G1000 avionics. No prior attendance or experience is required. This is an ideal starting point for someone who is ready to transition from traditional steam gauges to glass panel aircraft. After the seminar you may wish to schedule time in a G1000 simulator to practice what you learned before continuing on to your aircraft familiarization and checkout.
