Preparing for a Flight Review

Pilot certificates aren't issued with expiration dates, so the FAA requires pilots to fly with a flight instructor once every two years. The Flight Review, commonly called a Biennial Flight Review due to its 24-month cycle, is an important way to maintain competency, but also gives pilots a chance to pursue additional training. Are you due for a Flight Review soon? Would you like some tips on how to best prepare for it?Join SCFC CFI Miguel Mundo for a presentation about private pilot Flight Reviews and how to prepare so that yours goes smoothly. He will discuss both the ground and flight portions, and answer questions about what you will be expected to know and demonstrate. Recent changes to the Private Pilot PTS draw special attention to some new areas, such as the runway incursion prevention, weather services, aeronautical decision-making and risk management. If it's been awhile since your check ride, you'll want to hear more about those topics as they are fair game for the Flight Review Although the requirement for a Flight Review is every 24 calendar months, San Carlos Flight Center pilots are encouraged to work toward a tighter standard. Our Developmental Currency program encourages pilots to identify and work on improving at least one knowledge or skill area
