CFI Round-Table: The New SCFC Private Pilot Syllabus

The CFI Round Table series is devoted to topics of interest to Bay Area flight instructors. The events are open only to flight instructors and provides a behind-closed-doors forum for CFIs to share success stories and challenges with other CFIs. The CFI Round Table series is hosted at San Carlos Flight Center but is open to any Bay Area flight instructor. Each month we take on one or two topics and share our individual experiences and lessons learned. This month our discussion topic is the new SCFC Private Pilot Syllabus. San Carlos Flight Center has announced a new version of our Private Pilot Syllabus. The syllabus has been overhauled based on the input of the pilots and flight instructors who operate at our airport and neighboring airspace. The new syllabus follows a structured, progressive approach, emphasizing flight fundamentals and clear proficiency standards, and conveys our belief in an enriched training experience. Bay Area airspace is sophisticated and SCFC pilots are necessarily held to very high standards. Many CFIs are familiar with the syllabi offered by Jeppesen, ASA, King, Sporty's, or other publishers. Often these seemed designed more for marketing purposes, vying for who can mash the minimum training required to pass the Private Pilot

Practical Test into the shortest number of flights. While this method can work in a C152 with minimal avionics at an untowered airport in an uncongested area, it doesn't always work with modern avionics in a busy Class D airport under the final approach path to San Francisco's Class B airport.
