

Weather or Not: Weather Theory Review & Making the Go/No Go Decision!

Flight planning decisions based on aviation weather can dramatically affect the safety of flight. Mitigating the risks of weather starts with a solid understanding of weather theory. Ashley Helmetag, with NWS, will provide a review of aviation weather principles necessary to develop sound decision making skills relating to weather. She will cover pressure systems, stability, air mass characteristics, thunderstorms, inversions, wind shear and more. She will present an overview of the reports and forecasts available to help pilots make an educated "Go/No Go" decision. This presentation is open to all pilots and will be of particular interest to student pilots and those preparing for a flight review.
