# Spatial Disorientation

SCFC presents this safety seminar in support of the National FAA Safety Team's "Topic of the Month" initiative. This program identifies key safety issues and accident factors and brings them to the attention of the flying public to increase awareness and safety. SCFC welcomes CFII and author Jason Miller to address December's safety topic: Spatial Disorientation. Clinically, this refers to the lack of orientation with regards to a body's position in space. For pilots, this is the terrifying result of losing track of which way is up. Some flight conditions, such as optical illusions at night, or limited visibility due to clouds or smoke, combined with aircraft vibrations and noise can create a situation in which the pilot loses spatial orientation, a situation that often has fatal results. Jason's presentation will focus on what is happening when our body is sending us signals, the factors that cause us to experience spatial disorientation, as well as ways to prevent it. Current and aspiring pilots of all aircraft types will benefit from this informative and engaging presentation. We hope you will join us. Jason Miller has been teaching flying full time for the past 12 years. He is the creator and host of the popular podcast "The Finer Points of Flying."
