SFO Recap - VFR Operations in Class B

In early January 2015, a group of 20 pilots and 45 passengers from the Bay Area FlyOutGroup journeyed into Class B for a late night landing and party at San Francisco International Airport. None of the pilots had landed at SFO before and the event was part celebration of the new year and for some, training and an educational journey into Class B operations. Organizers coordinated with NorCal TRACON and SFO Tower, and the pilots briefed the flight plan as a group, all with the goal to reduce the risks identified for an activity of this sort - night ops, group flight of multiple aircraft, Class B operations. All 20 planes made it safely to SFO, and the party at Signature Flight Support was indeed a fun celebration to start the new year. Along the way, pilots learned many valuable lessons. Join us for a post-event debrief presented by the pilots who made the trip. We'll bring ATC audio recordings and radar traces, and a long list of things that went well and things that could have gone better. We'll share our understanding of the risks we experienced, and brainstorm ways to mitigate those risks in the future. A good pilot is always learning and we invite you to learn from our experiences to better manage your own future night flight, group flight, or flight into a Class B airport.
