CFI Round Table: Sharing Local Practice Areas

How do you share a limited resource like a flight training practice area? Safety suggests that only a few aircraft should share any practice area, but with no central control that can be hard to coordinate. San Carlos is one of five SF Bay Area airports that host multiple flight schools. That's a lot of students and instructors sharing a few practice areas. SCFC Chief Pilot Dan Dyer will lead a group discussion among local flight instructors about ways to better share local training areas. He'll share what he learned on a recent trip through Arizona about how some schools there share the areas. He will lead a discussion to clarify the common local practice areas so that CFIs and students can heighten their traffic awareness to better see and avoid other aircraft while operating in those areas. He will also open a dialogue about the pros and cons of proposing a common air-to-air radio frequency for use within these areas. If you're a flight instructor with students on the peninsula or the east bay, this would be a great meeting to participate in. This session is part of our standard monthly CFI Round-Table series, in which we invite flight instructors from around the Bay Area to share tips and ideas with their colleagues. All CFIs are invited to participate.
