Grand Canyon Special Flight Rules

One of the many cool things about the upcoming FOG trip to Sedona is the chance to see the Grand Canyon nearby. It's only a short destination north to take in the scenic majesty of this wonder of the natural world. Be sure to check your charts before you go, because the Grand Canyon is protected by a Special Flight Rules area. The rules help shield visitors on the ground from aircraft noise, and help protect GA pilots from commercial air tour operators and other pilots distracted by the beauty below. Join us for this review of the Grand Canyon Special Flight Rules area with SCFC and FlyOutGroup instructors Dan Dyer and Randall Walliser. They will describe the routes, altitudes, and radio frequencies that GA pilots can use to safely enjoy the panorama. Dan Dyer is Chief Pilot of San Carlos Flight Center and has been instructing for 11 years, first in helicopters and now in airplanes. He has almost 4,000 flight hours and is the Bay Area's local expert in crosswind landing instruction. He is known for finding simple and innovative ways to explain complex topics, and was one of the founders of the Bay Area FlyOutGroup - a social club of over 350 pilots that meet for lunches, dinners, and other fun aerial adventures.
