# **CFI Round Table: Mandatory Airport Security Awareness Training**

Air travel passengers see airports primarily as portals to their ultimate destination. Their time at airports is brief and they are mostly unaware of the workings going on around them. But as aviation professionals, airports are our workplace. We show up every day, and are intimately aware of the workings of the various teams that keep the airport safe. We have a responsibility to use our awareness to protect ourselves and those around us. Flight instructors and other airport workers are required to attend Airport Security Awareness Training at least once a year. This increases our safety, but also helps our industry combat the negative media attention we have received since 9/11. Join us on Monday, June 8 at 3:00 pm for the next CFI Round Table where the topic will be Airport Security. As a group, we'll view the training materials provided by the Transportation Security Administration (TSA) and the Aircraft Owners and Pilots Association (AOPA). We'll watch some videos, and we'll take some quizzes. A representative of SQL Airport will brief us on important local safety topics. We'll complete the training as a CFI group and receive individual training completion certificates. This training will meet the requirement for annual airport security awareness training.
