Managing the Unexpected

Flying is relatively easy, so long as everything goes as expected. However, at some point, every pilot will have to respond positively to events that are not 'in the plan'. How, then, do we prepare ourselves to prevent, recognize and properly respond to the unexpected? Come and listen as this highly experienced (18,000+ hours) flight instructor takes you through the human factors issues associated with managing the unexpected. The speaker will draw upon the research literature in aviation psychology and human factors to provide insights into the means by which pilots may better prevent, prepare for, and respond to unexpected events that threaten the fundamental responsibility of the Pilot-in-Command: the 'safe operation of the flight'. Issues addressed will include:

- Preparation
- Prevention
- Threat identification
- Risk evaluation
- Response planning and execution
- Human factors of decision-making under threat and uncertainty
- Case studies
