NOTAMs and TFRs

Basic airspace is complicated enough, and that's even with the chart open and in front of you. Beware of airspace changes that pop up and that don't appear on a VFR chart. We're talking about Notices to Airmen (NOTAMs) and Temporary Flight Restrictions (TFRs).

NOTAMs carry information of a timely or transitory nature that may not yet have made it into a green Airport/Facility Directories (A/FDs) or onto a VFR chart. This means airspace and the regulations controlling it has changed, and you are now bound to comply with the new rules, without any textual or graphical description yet appearing in a printed chart or other document. It's critical that pilots know how to access this time-sensitive information and check it before every flight.

In this presentation, SCFC Flight Instructor Reid Raisanen will overview the NOTAM system and discuss the various official sources for pilots to find current regulatory and advisory changes to the airspace system and the navigational aids available to pilots. He will discuss the most common types of NOTAMs, the TFRs most common to the San Francisco Bay Area, and the reasons the TFRs are put in place.
