# CFI Round Table: Teaching Weather Services

The only thing that changes more than the weather, are the weather services available to pilots. Today's pilots have direct access to a wealth of weather observations and forecasts, making cross-country flight safer and weather hazard avoidance easier. As CFIs, our challenge has increased. Fifty years ago, we only had to walk our students over to the Flight Service Station for a weather briefing. Then when Direct User Access Terminals began appearing in airport lobbies and pilot briefing rooms, we had to explain the coding rules used by the National Weather Service. Today, CFIs need to find a way to introduce and explain a seemingly endless number of charts, tables, and graphics, and even more importantly to show our students a repeatable method for sorting through all of this information to make informed Go and No Go flight decisions. Join us as we gather together as instructors, to share techniques for introducing our students to weather services. What websites do you use? What weather products and services do you require your students to check? Pre-Solo? Before a long cross-country? How do revolutions in in-flight weather services affect the typical Private Pilot candidate?
