

Easy Cross Country Flight - What Could Go Wrong?

An easy cross country flight, flown in a well-equipped plane ends up in the trees. What went wrong? What can we take away from this? Aircraft accidents deserve attention: They let us learn from others' mistakes, help us think critically about our skills, and provide a mental "nudge" if we find ourselves in similar situations.

In this safety seminar we will review a recent aviation accident that occurred during a flight from Santa Ana to Truckee. We will analyze the factors that contributed to this accident and along the way we will uncover some surprising new information.

Directions: Pilots who fly in should park in transient parking on the opposite side of the field and expect to walk about 10 minutes (.5 mile) to the Flight Center. Suite 215 is upstairs in the northwest corner. On occasion, rides may be prearranged through San Carlos Aviation and Supply.
