Join SCFC member and owner of N123TZ, Alex Marshall, on July 23rd for a recap of N123TZ's maiden international voyage to British Columbia, Canada. We will discuss pre-flight training, route planning, weather considerations, and provide tips for future international travelers. N123TZ is a 2004, G-1000 equipped 182T that has recently received special licensing for international travel with an FCC radio station license, as well as a US Customs & Border Protection decal.

Researching your destination is standard procedure for pilots, but what about if your flight includes a border crossing? What's the safest way to overfly a foreign country? An exotic destination doesn't free the pilot from very important safety decisions on the ground and in flight - in fact, they increase the planning responsibility. Join SCFC members as we listen and learn from Alex Marshall's travels abroad. What worked well? What didn't work?
