# Flight Planning and Execution of a Trip Across the USA

Join us at West Valley Flying Club's San Carlos classroom for a safety seminar entitled "A Trip Across the USA." The seminar will be held on Wednesday, September 21st at 7:30pm.

Ever thought about flying across the country and back? Join us for a discussion of the planning and execution of a flight from the Peninsula to Texas, Rhode Island, Wisconsin, Iowa, Colorado, Truckee, and back to the Bay Area. Alan Marcum logged nearly 37 hours and 3 IMC approaches, and burned over 440 gallons of 100LL during this trip.

Safety topics will focus on things that affect long cross country trips including weather/diversions, fuel planning, fatigue, and operating at unfamiliar airports.

Our speaker, Alan Marcum, PPASEL (Instrument), has been flying for over thirty years, from Cambridge, U.K. to Lihue, Hawai'i, in airplanes from a Tiger Moth and a Waco to a Malibu and a Mooney. He bases his Mooney at Palo Alto, where he learned to fly. Alan is a computer scientist by profession.

**Directions:** From highway 101 head east toward the bay, and take two immediate right-turns onto Skyway (along the west side of the airport). The Skyway building is on the left after the Aviation Museum.
