IFR Distilled- The Essence of IFR Flight

Most pilots know that "Instrument" is an additional rating that can be added to the back of a pilot certificate. Most know that it involves flying through clouds, and shooting instrument approaches. More training, more knowledge, etc. But what does the Instrument Rating really mean? What is the essence of instrument flight?

Dave Kramer, Instrument Ground Instructor and public educator, has created distilled down a vision of the IFR rating. If you are a VFR pilot and completely terrified of all the procedures of IFR, this presentation will help. If you're an IFR pilot, this is a great way to focus your knowledge and experience into the key elements. Dave shares his experiences of instrument flying over the past year and unveils his distillation of IFR down to a few mnemonics. This will be a fun opportunity for seasoned pilots in the audience to share their techniques as well.
