# Topics for General Aviation in California

We will learn about issues facing general aviation from our speaker, the president of CalPilots. He will explain how the “Three Tiers of Aviation Advocacy” apply directly to us. Among the informative topics presented will be the proposed airspace changes in California and newly approved ones that will soon go into effect. We will become briefed and we will better understand the impact on our flying.

Our speaker, Corl Leach became president of the California Pilots Association in 2014. Occupying the left seat of a Boeing in his day job, he brings a 40-year aeronautical background as a civilian flight instructor, military pilot, corporate jet jockey, and airline aviator. An ardent believer in the strength of effective organization, he is striving for California aviation entities to speak with a consistent and unified voice.
