But do we really understand why the wind is blowing from a particular direction, why the thunderstorms are where they are or which clouds are more hazardous for icing than others.

Dave Kramer as been on a 3 year journey following obtaining his instrument rating exploring weather theory and why the atmosphere behaves the way it does. Many of you have attended his seminars and have joined him. In this workshop, Dave will discuss all the weather theory a pilot will need to know and how to the think of the atmosphere not only horizontally but vertically. He will also use the Skew T Log p diagram as a tool to examine the vertical profile of the atmosphere which will really aid in understanding weather.
