

## High Altitude Physiology

Flying in the flight levels has its advantages; no terrain or obstacles to get in our way, less traffic to bump into, quieter frequencies, less frequent changes to our clearances, etc. But danger does lurk in the rare air! Learn what it takes to fly there safely on purpose. Flying safely by accident is not a viable option.

**Directions:** From HWY 49 and Parrotts Ferry Road, drive north on Parrotts Ferry through the old town of Columbia. Turn left onto Airport Road (north of the airport). Proceed to Chile Gulch Road and turn left. In just a few feet, turn left again, cross a cattle guard and continue on a gravel road to the airport perimeter gate. It will open automatically as you approach the sensor. Follow the road to the Pavillion located at the campground site.
