

Emergencies NOT found in the POH / AFM

The POH / AFM under Section 3 contains procedures to manage emergencies. These procedures do NOT contain details / guidance for off-nominal conditions. As an example, an alternator failure in IMC or at night. In these situations, procedures will vary. What about other emergencies not in the POH / AFM?

Vibrations, fuel / oil in the cockpit, limited / reduced control power? It's the pilot's responsibility to manage the emergency to a safe outcome. This presentation will review select emergency procedures under various conditions and provide insight on managing emergencies that you normally would NOT find in the POH / AFM.
