CFI Open Forum Loss of Control/AC Performance and Limitations

This is a CFI Open Forum for all CFIs, but all pilots are welcome.
Las Vegas DPEs will be in attendance for Q&A.

This much discussed topic seems to be old hat, but Loss of Control still ranks #1 as the leading cause of GA accidents. This seminar looks into the causes of some accidents and the events leading up to them.

Included is a technical look at stall speeds, maneuvering speed, and angle of attack. We'll discover how they are designed into the airfoil and what makes them change. We'll take an in-depth look at what improper actions cause inadvertent stalls and spins and how to recover from them. For the CFI, recovery techniques are taught using scenario based training. The course stresses the importance of practicing maneuvers to maintain proper skills and proficiency in flight. Stephen Ruks, speaker, is an ATP rated pilot and CFII. He has been flying since 1960 and a flight instructor since 1975. He spent 4 years in US Navy Air and 5 years with Lockheed Aircraft prior to a 34 year career with the FAA. He has about 10,000 hours total time with 3000 hours in single engine GA aircraft in Alaska as a commercial 135 pilot.
