



AIRWORTHINESS DIRECTIVES

-
- Identify a known safety deficiency in certified aircraft
 - Apply to airframes, aircraft engines, propellers, and any installed components, equipment, or avionics
 - Require deficiencies be safety compliant before the affected aircraft is returned to service
 - Render an aircraft unairworthy when not corrected by the required date
-

Airworthiness Directives are available to aircraft owners, operators, and mechanics from many commercial aircraft manufacturers, vendors, and the FAA.

DON'T FORGET to meet compliance standards for any aftermarket accessories and nonstandard equipment.
