HONOLULU CONTROL FACILITY LETTER TO AIRMEN NO. 12-08

SUBJECT: Land and Hold Short Operations at Honolulu International Airport

CANCELLATION: November 26, 2014

Pilots are advised that Land and Hold Short Operations (LAHSO) at Honolulu International Airport are in place for Runways 4 and 8L. Pulsating white LAHSO lights are installed on Runways 4L, 4R, and 8L to mark the available landing distance (ALD) on each runway as follows:


ALD for landing Runway 8L to hold short of Runway 4L is 9,300 feet.

ALD for landing Runway 4L to hold short of Runway 8L is 3,700 feet.

ALD for landing Runway 4R to hold short of Runway 8L is 6,250 feet.

When LAHSO is in effect, an advisory will be broadcast on the ATIS (127.9/251.15 MHz). Pilots must advise HCF Approach on initial contact on 118.3/269.0, or 119.1/239.05, if a land-and-hold-short clearance cannot be accepted.

When landing to hold short of a crossing runway, pilots may expect arriving aircraft on the crossing runway to roll through the intersection, or taxiing aircraft/vehicles to proceed across the runway beyond the hold-short point.
